PAT MORTON LOOKOUT

LIGHTHOUSE BEACH

BALLINA RIVERFRONT



Stretch your legs and take a scenic stroll along Ballina's stunning riverfront,

The Historic Ballina Waterfront (The North Wall, Lighthouse Parade to Moon Street, Ballina) trail extends along the Richmond River, and showcases Ballina's history and the River's significance to the community. From here you can walk the entire way to the town centre along the riverfront. Keep your eyes open for the amazing marine life you might encounter; dolphins, turtles and birdlife, to name a few. The North Wall is a 900m walk from the Lighthouse Stuff Club.



BALLINA ATTRACTIONS

The original college dining room is now an elegant fine dining rootal years.

The **Northern Rivers Community Gallery** (NRCG) (corner of Cherry and Crane Streets, Ballina) is housed in the historiand former Ballina Municipal Council Chambers built in 1927. The Gallery hosts innovative exhibitions and excitir workshops. It oozes charm and ever changing exhibition houses a range of local giftware, and an excellent café. A to the Callery is a must
